# Stewardship Pledge Campaign Update...

Last Sunday, November 24th, we began gathering our 2026 Pledge Commitment Cards.

As of November 25<sup>th</sup> our Annual Pledge Campaign has received 32 pledge commitments totaling \$141,586.00. Of the 32 pledge commitments submitted thus far, 26 pledgers have increased their 2026 pledge to Zion's mission and ministries. The total amount of the increase in pledges is currently \$26,800.00.


